Gospel Reflection

Our religious tradition is founded on love. Actually, life itself is grounded in love. We may not always feel this love, but if we allow ourselves to reflect on life, we will realise this truth. We have been called into being by God's love; and we will only be happy if we live in that love. Thus, when we are directed to love God and love one another, we are not being asked to do something contrary to our nature. Rather, we are being told to live in accord with that nature. We come from God who is love, and so it is in our very nature to love and to be loved.

We may sometimes think that it is easier to love God than to love others. It may actually be just the opposite. Other people are tangible. We can see and hear them, interact with them. Their influence in our lives can permeate our consciousness. That is not the way it is with God. Like Moses on the mountain, we can only see the traces of divinity as God passes by (see Ex 33:23). However, we show that we love God in the way we love our neighbour.

Love, the foundation of the reign of God, is contagious. When we love others, the reign of God spreads throughout the world. The compassion that we show toward others is a form of evangelisation. WHAT DOES THE CATHOLIC CHURCH TEACH ABOUT MIGRANTS AND REFUGES?



The right to seek asylum
The Catholic Church teaches
that anyone whose life is
threatened has the right to
protection. Whether because

of persecution, armed conflicts, natural disasters, or economic conditions that threaten their lives or physical integrity. It is the element of persecution, threat or danger, or being forcibly displaced that gives rise to a right to seek asylum rather than to migrate through ordinary channels.

3. The difference between an asylum seeker and a refugee

An asylum seeker is someone who is seeking international protection but whose claim for refugee status has not yet been determined. A refugee is someone who has been recognised under the international 1951 Convention to be a refugee.

THE RIGHT TO BE PART OF A COMMUNITY

The Catholic Church teaches that all people have the right to be part of a community. Asylum seekers who have been forced from their homeland have a duty to integrate into the host community. We must favour this integration by helping migrants to find a place where they can live in peace and safety, where they can work and take on the rights and duties that exist in the country that welcomes them.

10 Essential Facts about People seeking asylum Boat people are not 'queue jumpers'

There is no queue for asylum seekers to join (it is more like a lottery). Less than 1% of the world's refugees are resettled by the UNHCR in any given year and less than 20% of refugees are registered with the UNHRC in order to be resettled.


DIOCESAN APPOINTMENT

HOLY COMMUNION DISTRIBUTION DURING



MASS

After meetings with the Acolytes and Special ministers and the Liturgy committee, which noted sometimes the

congestion around where the ministers distributed the cup sometimes deterred people from receiving the Blood of Christ, it was decided to trial a different route for reception of the Body and Blood of Christ. This new process involves people sitting in the far quadrants of the church pews (not the middle quadrants). They will be asked to process to the outer aisle (on the windows sides) and walk towards the sanctuary receiving the Body of Christ from the minister then proceeding to the middle aisles and if they so wish to receive the Blood of Christ from the minister positioned at that point and then return to their seats via that aisle. We have begun this trial and a visual diagram will be placed on the overhead TVs to remind us of this new process. We will evaluate it after a month to see if it facilitates easier distribution.
