An acolyte, who is an ordained Minister of the Church, also assists at the Altar during Mass and on occasions may be called upon to conduct Holy Communion services when Priests not are available. Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion assist at Mass with the distribution of communion.

Acolytes and Ministers are selected by the Parish Priest and are required to undertake study in the protocols and procedures for the performance of their duties.
