Gospel Reflection

The question of legitimacy of ministry is not a new one. There is a certain amount of tension between the institutional and the charismatic aspects of the church. To say that one is Spirit-driven and the other is not is to misunderstand Jesus' promise to remain with the church until the end of time. God normally calls ministers through the structures of the community. The authorities of the church are usually the ones who make the ultimate decisions about the needs of the church, how these needs are to be met, and who is to meet them. That is one of the responsibilities of their office

However, God calls in other ways as well. A solid biblical tradition maintains that the Spirit is not confined to human structure or custom. We see this in the judges, the prophets, and even the early kings. The Pentecost story describes the coming of the Spirit upon all people – sons and daughters, young and old, slaves and free. When God calls it is up to us to recognise that call and to test its spirit. Perhaps the primary criterion we have for judging is the biblical measure: By their fruits you shall know them.

Today we also see that those who benefit from exploitation of the vulnerable will reap the fruits of their sin. This warning stems from the belief in the justice of God. Just as we believe that God will not allow the righteous to go unrewarded, so we are confident that neither will the wicked escape punishment.

PLENARY 2020

Plenary 2020 is the name given to a process initiated by the Australian Bishops who are inviting people to engage in listening, dialogue and discernment about the future of the Catholic Church in Australia ahead of a Plenary Council in 2020. Significantly, a process such as this has not happened in Australia since 1937. Our voices are needed and we are invited to engage with family, friends and colleagues in this time of renewal.

All parishioners are invited to attend a parish level response to the Plenary Council at one of two sessions of consultation to take place at Mary Mackillop Hall.

These consultations will be held on **Sunday 21 October** after the 10 am Mass beginning around 11:30 am and concluding at approximately 2:30pm (BYO Lunch, beverages will be provided) or alternatively a session will be held on **Wednesday 7 November** beginning at 7:30 pm. Dr John Collins our trainee deacon and Head of the Christian Life and Ministry department of the Catholic Institute of Sydney will facilitate both sessions.

We also welcome people who live in our area who may no longer practise their faith or are on the fringe of the Church for various reasons to contribute to this dialogue.

The Bible Society's RIMS (Remote Indigenous Ministries Support) Project, is a major undertaking and part of The Bible Society of Australia's 200th Anniversary push to provide scriptures to Australia's first people, our Aboriginals.

These projects have been endorsed by Archbishop Christopher Prowse Canberra & Goulburn Diocese, Sydney Auxiliary Bishop Terry Brady, Sydney Auxiliary Bishop Richard Umbers, Darwin Bishop Emeritus Eugene Hurley, Parramatta Bishop Vincent Long Van Nguyen, Federal Member of Parliament Ms. Linda Burney and Federal Senator Patrick Dodson.

Funding is desperately needed to support the printing and distribution of the Murrinhpatha Mini Bible, Modern Tiwi project, Eastern & Central Arrente Bible translation (New Testament and Old Testament portions) & Kriol Audio Indigenous Scriptures for our Indigenous brothers & sisters in Australia. In summary, the RIMS Project is divided into four fundamental areas: Publication of Indigenous Bibles, Recording of Indigenous Scripture, supporting indigenous translation, Designing Indigenous Bible resources and workshops.
