CHANGE IN MASS TIME?

It has been mooted at both the Liturgy Committee and Parish Pastoral Council that the numbers attending Saturday evening mass at 6pm are dwindling. Some reasons have been proffered including the reality that some are attending Mass at North Parramatta due to its earlier time of 5pm which allows for people to go out after Mass on Saturday evening. It has been suggested that we move the time of the Saturday vigil to 5:30pm so as not to be in direct competition with North Parramatta but to allow for parishioners who do like to go out on Saturday evening after Mass an earlier option. Whilst it is hard to get a unanimous consensus about this, the Parish Pastoral Council are interested in hearing from the stakeholders in this decision: including musicians, readers and special ministers of the Eucharist as well as other parishioners.
