REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

The Second Sunday of Lent celebrates the epiphanies of God, the ways in which God's divine presence is revealed. The first divine epiphany is the manifestation of God as one who initiates a covenant, an intimate relationship with human beings. Not only does God initiate this agreement, but God also seals it with blood, making it official. Although we ritualise our relationship with God in a religious setting, the call to enter into the covenant can come in the ordinary events of life. The important thing to remember about this covenant is that God enters into our lives and initiates the relationship. No life is too simple; no life is too busy. Human history in all of its contours is the setting for the encounter with God.

The glory of God is revealed in the transfigured Jesus, the one who discussed his suffering and death with Moses and Elijah. Lent is a time for us to enter into this suffering, not merely though reflection, prayer and penance, but concretely, by sharing in the suffering of the body of Christ. We see this suffering all around us.

God is revealed through women and men who live lives of Christian commitment. In those whose integrity strengthens us, in those whose religious sentiments inspire us, in those whose endurance gives us confidence. God is revealed in those who get involved in bettering the lives of others. God is revealed in very ordinary ways, if we but open our eyes to see.

COVID UPDATE FOR PLACES OF WORSHIP

The NSW Government has announced changes in regard to COVID-19 restrictions. Check-in using the NSW QR code and record keeping for attendees is no longer required. Both choir and congregation are able to sing at religious services at our churches. Masks are no longer mandatory for places of worship. However, masks are still strongly encouraged where you cannot maintain a safe distance from others. Density limits are no longer applicable for our churches.

LOCAL MINISTRY TRAINING PROGRAM

Due to the fact that the Diocesan liturgical ministry formation program is oversubscribed we (the parish team) have decided to conduct our own program for Senior Servers (acolytes) and Special Ministers of the Eucharist for the assembly, and for the sick. It will take place on Tuesday afternoons from 3:30pm to 5pm in the Church beginning on 15 March for four weeks. Teachers from the school will also be joining the program. If you would like to take on any of these ministries (and you are eighteen years or older), please email the parish office or connect with one of the parish team.

LECTORS REQUIRED

Volunteers are required to assist in proclaiming the Passion gospel at the 3 Palm Sunday Masses and at the Good Friday 3pm celebration of the Passion of the Lord. These readers would be required to attend a practice session in the church a week prior to the scheduled celebrations. For Palm Sunday readers, they would be required to practice in the church at 10:30am on Saturday 2nd April and for Good Friday readers, a practice is scheduled on Saturday, 9th April at 10:30am. Please contact the parish office if you would like to take part in either of these ceremonies.

LENTEN PROGRAM GROUPS

SUNDAY NIGHT SESSIONS

A series of presentations, seminars, workshops, discussions, and stories designed to invite adults (young and old) to grow and develop in their faith. Each session begins at 7.00pm and finishes at 8.30pm and is held in the CTK Parish Hall or Church. Sessions are designed to provide an opportunity for participants to ask questions, share thoughts and ideas and learn new stuff. The aim of the sessions is to further develop a community of mature inquisitive Catholics at Christ the King. Everyone 16 and over is welcome to participate.

Sunday Night Sessions are to be held on the 2nd Sunday of the month from February to November. A Gold Coin Donation to assist with the cost of coffee, tea and biscuits is welcome. The session on tonight takes up the theme of **Reconciliation** as Tom Peat explores a practical method of promoting and achieving reconciliation.

The April session is on the contemplative method of reading Scripture *Lectio Divina* and is to be presented in the Church by Dawn Peat.
