REFLECTION

The leprosy of Naaman and the ten men in the gospel serves as a metaphor for sinfulness, the condition that makes us unfit for the presence of God and despicable in the eyes of others. Separated from God and alienated from society, we are truly in a deplorable state, a state out of which we are unable to extricate ourselves. Into these seemingly hopeless conditions step the prophet Elisha and Jesus. Each in his own way brings the healing power of God, the saving grace of God. Paul is such a mediator as well. He brings the gospel to those who are in need of salvation. When people are open to his preaching, they are transformed and made ready to receive eternal glory.

After healing come gratitude and praise. Both Naaman and the lone Samaritan are so filled with gratitude that they return to the one responsible for their healing. They are not so preoccupied with their good fortune as to forget that it came to them as a gift. Their response is the kind of thanks and praise that is proclaimed in the psalm and that is also celebrated at each Sunday Eucharist. We have been saved from our alienation from God and from each other so let us give thanks to the Lord.

Those who know that they have been healed, who realize that this was a gift freely given to them, and who return to give thanks have, by these acts of devotion, stepped over a threshold into a new way of living. Their thanks and praise usher them into a new age, the age of eschatological promise.

THE SACRAMENT OF FIRST RECONCILIATION

A meeting will take place on Wednesday, 19 October beginning at 7:30pm in the church for parents/guardians (not children) wishing to enrol their children In the First Reconciliation Program. To be eligible children must be in year three or above. First reconciliation is a prerequisite for children to undertake the other two sacraments of initiation, First Eucharist and Confirmation. PARISH GOLDEN JUBILEE

To commemorate and celebrate (belatedly due to Covid) the fifty years of our parish existence (the parish was instituted on 3 February 1970 and Father Eric Burton appointed the first parish priest) the parish will celebrate the Eucharist, presided over by Bishop Vincent, on Saturday, 19th November at 5:30pm, the feast of Christ the King. After the Mass supper will be shared in the parish hall.

FINANCE COMMITTEE UPDATE

Bishop Vincent has approved the long-proposed building of a new presbytery in 10 Burradoo Close, North Rocks which paves the way for the demolition of the existing building on that site and the construction of a new presbytery with DA approval from Parramatta Council. Eventually the current parish office/presbytery will be converted to better facilities for the parish, enabling small groups to meet and the parish office being more accessible. It is hoped that this renovated building will be called the Burton Centre after the founding parish priest, Father Eric.

SUNDAY NIGHT SESSION TONIGHT

A series of presentations, seminars, workshops, discussions, and stories designed to invite adults (young and old) to grow and develop in their faith. Each session begins at 7:00pm and finishes at 8:30pm and is held in the CTK Parish Hall. Sessions are designed to provide an opportunity for participants to ask questions, share thoughts and ideas and learn new stuff.
