SAVE CALVARY HOSPITAL

There is a petition to the Members of the ACT Legislative Assembly to reverse a decision of the ACT government to compulsorily acquire Calvary Hospital in Canberra. This removes the ownership and management from Calvary Health Care, a Catholic operator, and gives the ownership to the government-run, non-faith-based Canberra Health Services instead.
