PARRAMATTA DIOCESAN SYNOD

Bishop Vincent is convoking a Diocesan Synod which will be held from the 12th to 15th October 2023. A Synod is both an event and a process where clergy, consecrated, and the laity gather to discuss important matters relating to the life and mission of the Church. This Synod will gather clergy, religious, and the laity across our Diocese to listen, discern, and respond to the Holy Spirit through voices of the People of God in Western Sydney and The Blue Mountains. From May to July 2023, in the lead up to the Synod, all are invited to participate in deanery and parish listening consultations, organising time to discuss with family and friends, and engaging in opportunities to dialogue.

At Christ the King Parish, a listening consultation will take place on **Sunday**, **21st May from 7:00 to 8:30pm** and again on **Wednesday**, **24th May from 7:00 to 8:30pm** in the Parish Hall. Parishioners are welcome to attend either evening and contribute to this ongoing consultation and listening exercise.

WE'VE JUST BECOME AN EARTHCARE PARISH!

In 2015, Pope Francis wrote his environmental encyclical Laudato Si' in which he implored us to protect our common home. To escalate the implementation of Laudato Si', Pope Francis then established the Laudato Si' Action Platform with its 7 Goals. Our Australian Bishops Social Justice Statement 2021-22, 'Cry of the Earth, Cry of the Poor' reinforced the call to care for all creation and invited us to join them in taking action and committing to the Laudato Si' goals. Catholic Earthcare Australia has made it easy for parishes to take up the Bishops' invitation by developing a process to assist us on the journey towards these 7 goals and to becoming living Laudato Si' communities. Christ the King Parish has signed up and our Step 1 Certificate is proudly on display on the noticeboard. We have received the Earthcare Parish Audit and look forward to the sharing the journey with you all.

SUNDAY NIGHT SESSION NEXT WEEKEND

A series of presentations, seminars, workshops, discussions, and stories designed to invite adults (young and old) to grow and develop in their faith. Each session begins at 7:00pm and finishes at 8:30pm and is held in the CTK Parish Hall. Sessions are designed to provide an opportunity for participants to ask questions, share thoughts and ideas and learn new stuff. The aim of the sessions is to further develop a community of mature inquisitive Catholics at Christ the King. Everyone 16 and over is welcome to participate. GIVE 6 THINGS TO JRS FOODBANK OVER 6 WEEKS

Right now the Jesuit Refugee Service is supporting 150 families a week and the demand for help keeps growing. Many of the families that are served are not eligible for Centrelink, Medicare and don't have work or study rights. With the cost of living rising many are struggling to have enough food to get their kids through the week. Any and all support is greatly appreciated. To help keep everyone fed, parishioners are asked to donate one item a week:

Week 1: Cooking oil (1L - 2L bottles)

Week 2: Basmati Rice (1kg - 5kg bags)

Week 3: Long life milk (1L bottles)

Week 4: Tuna in oil (425g cans)

Week 5: Pantry essentials (Sugar, salt, instant coffee, tea bags)

Week 6: Liquid laundry detergent

Items can be left in the Church fover and will be taken by a member of the parish to the JRS office.
