REFLECTION

The readings for this Sunday call us to self-examination. The gospel describes various levels of receptivity, the willingness to allow ourselves to receive from another, to be influenced by another, perhaps even to be transformed. The more independent we are, the less likely we will be open to others and, consequently, less receptive to their ideas. By definition disciples are receptive to the one they follow. To be a disciple of Jesus requires receptivity, so it is important that we scrutinise ourselves to discover the extent to which we are open. To what should we be receptive? To the words of Scripture, the words of the liturgy, the words of the sacraments, the living tradition of the community. God's word is sown in many forms and under many guises. It makes little difference who sows the seed. How will we receive it?

Besides the word of God, the readings speak of the world of God. The people of biblical times were aware of the revelation of God in and through the natural world. Isaiah teaches about the effectiveness of the word of God through the metaphor of rain. The psalmist uses the natural world to describe God's work of salvation. Paul claims that eschatological fulfilment will include all of creation.

Finally, Jesus' parables are rooted in stories about nature. We cannot afford to close our eyes to the needs of the natural world, or stop our ears to the cries of the earth, or harden our hearts to the world of which we are a part, for the word of God will accomplish the end for which God sent it.

BAPTISM WELCOME

THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION

The Sacrament of Confirmation will be conferred in our parish on Wednesday, 20th September commencing at 7:30pm. In accord with Parramatta Diocesan policy we will conduct a parish-based, family centred, school supported method of preparation for the children to receive this sacrament.

A pre-requisite of children being confirmed is that they have already received First Holy Communion. Children who have been baptised in Eastern Rite (Uniate Churches, e.g. Maronite, Melchite, Ukranian, Chaldean etc.) may have already been confirmed at Baptism and do not need to participate in this programme if this is the case.

Children in Year Five and above are eligible to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

The program for preparation will commence with an information meeting for parents/guardians on **Wednesday**, **26th July commencing at 7:30pm** in the Church, where the program will be explained and any questions answered. This is a significant step in your child's journey of faith. It is vital that parents/guardians attend this meeting.

GOOD NEIGHBOURHOOD GROUP

SUNDAY NIGHT SESSION - 13 AUGUST

A series of presentations, seminars, workshops, discussions, and stories designed to invite adults (young and old) to grow and develop in their faith. Each session begins at 7:00pm and finishes at 8:30pm and is held in the CTK Parish Hall. Sessions are designed to provide an opportunity for participants to ask questions, share thoughts and ideas and learn new stuff. The next session, on Sunday, 13th August is 'Mary Magdalene: The Myths and the Biblical Texts' presented by Dr Debra Snoddy from the Catholic Institute of Sunday and the University of Notra Dame.

This talk will engage parishioners in the process of recovering the biblical portrait of Mary Magdalene. In 1969 Paul VI confirmed that she was a disciple who came with Jesus from Galilee and stayed with him at the cross when most of his followers had left. On the third day, she went to his tomb early, searched for, and encountered the risen Christ. Her discipleship of Jesus is confirmed when Jesus himself sent her to be the apostle to the apostles. So, how was it that, for much of the Christian era, she has been viewed as a penitent, a fallen woman? Why has her image as a penitent remained so strong in Christianity, and particularly in Roman Catholicism? Even in more recent publications used in popular Roman Catholic devotion, she is still portrayed as "the adulterous woman the Pharisees want to stone." There is an attempt to make a determined effort in Roman Catholicism to improve the biblical literacy of the faithful and their understanding of this Saint of Saints.
