REFLECTION by Dianne Bergant CSA

Today we see three snapshots from the photo album of life.

Suffering comes to everyone. It can take such a hold of us that the happiness of the past is swallowed up, the beauty of better days is forgotten, and the hope of a brighter future is imperilled. Life ceases to be an adventure and takes on the guise of drudgery. At such times suffering appears to be our permanent fate, and life seems too short for suffering to run its course. If we become identified with our distress, we will be tormented.

Jesus knew the harshness of life, because he was one of us. He saw it in the lives of those he loved, and he was touched by their torment. He came to release people from the demons that possess them, from the illness that undermined their lives. He came to bring the reign of God, the reign of peace and fulfilment. He came to heal the broken-hearted, to bind up their wounds.

Paul was a messenger of this gospel of salvation and fulfilment. He was so committed to his mission that he empathised with all those who heard his preaching – the slaves, the weak, the broken-hearted, all those who knew well the harshness of life. Now it is our turn. We are the disciples who must bring the good news to the broken-hearted, to those who are enslaved, to those who are weak. We are the ones who will then share in the blessings of this good news.

OPEN HOUSE

At the conclusion of Masses this weekend, parishioners are welcome to visit the new presbytery. Access to the new presbytery will be via the church left-hand side pathway and through the fence. You are then invited to climb the stairs at the back of the building to see the new quarters. If you wish to see downstairs where the priest retirement unit is located go down the interior stairs and turn right and enter via the left-hand door. Children should only enter if they are accompanied by an adult.

ASH WEDNESDAY

The beginning of the season of Lent (at least for Latin rite Roman Catholics) begins on Wednesday 14 February. The parish will celebrate two Masses on that day, 9am with the primary students from the school and Mass at 7:30pm. At both of these Masses Ashes will be distributed on the forehead. It is interesting to note, as we have many Lebanese living in our parish, that the blessing and distribution of the Ashes on Ash Wednesday is originally a Latin (Western) Rite celebration. The Maronites adopted this celebration from the Western Church and placed it on the Monday after Cana Sunday which is why they begin Lent on Ash Monday (12 February). No matter what day Lent begins for you in your tradition, it is a period of preparation for the great feasts of Easter and a time of discernment, reflection, and repentance.

SPECIAL RELIGIOUS EDUCATION - VOLUNTEERS NEEDED.

Classes at Carlingford West Public School are held on Wednesdays at the following times: 1:25 to 2:05pm; 2:05 to 2:45pm; 2:45 to 3:15pm

We use the Christ Our Light and Life Program. Teachers have a handbook which gives detailed notes to follow for each lesson. Students have an Activity Book which has a variety of activities for each lesson. Training for volunteers is held each year with classes being held either face to face or online. BURTON CENTRE

When Father Ian moves into the new presbytery, to distinguish between the two buildings, the old presbytery will be called the Burton Centre, in commemoration of Christ the King's foundational parish priest, Fr Eric Burton. This building will continue to host the parish offices and allow for small meeting rooms for parish activities.

CHRIST THE KING OPENING SCHOOL MASS

Mass for the beginning of the school year will be celebrated this Wednesday, 7 February at 9:15am in the Church. Parishioners, please note the change of time for the start of Mass. The extra 15 minutes will allow the school time to enter the church. Mass will return to 9am start the following week.

SUNDAY NIGHT SESSIONS

A series of presentations, seminars, workshops, discussions and stories designed to invite adults (young and old) to grow and develop in their faith. Each session begins at 7:00pm and finishes at 8:30pm and is held in the CTK Parish Hall. They are held on the 2nd Sunday of the month from February to November.

The next Session is on Sunday, 11th February and the topic is "Why Do Lent". This topic, led by Dr Debra Snoddy, will take broad looking perspective on the Season of Lent. What does it mean to "do" Lent, and "do it properly"? We will look at the reasons and motivations for Lent and why, as Catholics, we continue with this tradition which seems so out of step with the modern world. What can we gain from the experiences that Lent has to offer? And why bother keeping its practises alive anyway?

Come along to be challenged and guided into this significant season in the Catholic calender.

6 WEEKS OF LENT – GIVE 6 THINGS TO JRS FOODBANK

Right now, Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS) Australia is supporting 150 families a week, and the demand for help keeps growing. The families we serve are not eligible for Centrelink or Medicare and many don't have work or study rights. With the rising cost of living, many are struggling to have enough food and essential items to meet their family's weekly needs. Any and all support would be greatly appreciated during the Lenten season where we are called to remember Jesus' sacrifice and love.

To help keep everyone fed, we are asking parishioners to donate one item a week:

1st Sunday of Lent, 18 Feb: Basmati rice;

3rd Sunday of Lent, 3 March: Dried red lentils; 5th Sunday of Lent, 17 March: Laundry detergent; 2nd Sunday of Lent, 25 Feb: Cooking or olive oil 4th Sunday of Lent, 10 March: Dishwashing detergent; Palm Sunday, 24 March: Long life milk.
