6 WEEKS OF LENT – GIVE 6 THINGS TO JRS FOODBANK

Right now, Jesuit Refugee Service (JRS) Australia is supporting close to 200 families a week, and the demand for help keeps growing. The families we serve are not eligible for Centrelink or Medicare and many don't have work or study rights. With the rising cost of living, many are struggling to have enough food and essential items to meet their family's weekly needs. Any and all support would be greatly appreciated during the Lenten season where we are called to remember Jesus' sacrifice and love.

To help keep everyone fed, we are asking parishioners to donate one item a week:

1st Sunday of Lent, 18 Feb: Basmati rice; 2nd Sunday of Lent, 25 Feb: Cooking or olive oil

3rd Sunday of Lent, 3 March: Dried red lentils; 4th Sunday of Lent, 10 March: Dishwashing detergent;

5th Sunday of Lent, 17 March: Laundry detergent; Palm Sunday, 24 March: Long life milk.
