REFLECTION

The feast of the Holy Trinity brings us face to face with the foundation of our faith. The readings for today provide answers to the question: Who is God? They can really only suggest something about the mystery of God, and they can do this only indirectly. They call to mind some of the wonders that God has accomplished for us and in us. It is through reflection on these gracious divine acts that we can get glimpses of God.

The psalm declares that the harmony and interdependence that we see in creation point to a majestic creator responsible for it all. The account of the history of God's people reveals a God who desires to establish an intimate relationship with them, enters their history as protector and guide, and forgives disloyalty. Finally, Jesus teaches that God sent him into the world to save it, has made us adopted children through the Holy Spirit, and will ultimately clothe us in divine glory. It is from his teaching that we hear that the Son was sent by the Father, the Spirit, which was also his Spirit, proceeded from the Father and from him.

From our own experience, we know that God creates, because we are immersed in creation. We know that God saves, because we have been freed from the bondage of our own demons. Our experience tells us that God is with us, and that God is for us. Everything that we know about God declares that God is passionately in love with us, boundlessly so!

SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST



Next weekend, the Feast of the Body & Blood of Christ, 29 young members of our parish community will be initiated into the ongoing life of the Church by receiving the Eucharist for the first time. This will occur at 2 parish Masses - Saturday 5:30pm (9), and Sunday 10:00am (20). Two weekends later (due to the public holiday next weekend), 15/16 June, they will receive

certificates acknowledging this event at all three weekend Masses.

It is essential that these children (with a parent/guardian) attend the practise evening this Wednesday 29 May at 7:30pm in the Church. If this cannot occur for a legitimate reason, please contact the Parish Office on 9871 8710 before the practise date.

Whilst there may be some inconvenience to the regular worshipping community (e.g. parking & seating positions) the joy of welcoming them will hopefully outweigh this. The children will sit in the centre 2 blocks of the Church. The pews reserved will have the children's names on them. Communion will be distributed to the first Communicants and families down the centre aisle. Special Ministers of Holy Communion will distribute Communion to other family members and parishioners at the side aisles of the Church. Your cooperation is appreciated on this weekend. The school gates will be opened to allow access to the Church from parking in Burradoo Close and Bowral Street.

THE PASSIONIST FAMILY GROUP MOVEMENT

The Passionist Family Group Movement began in Australia over 50 years ago to meet a very evident need for parishioners to meet and socialise as a family with other families. The principal aim is to help parishioners to get to know one another and so build a strong commitment to the Parish and each other. The idea is that you meet with other parishioners occasionally for low or no cost outings. These

gatherings, in turn, enrich your experience of the Parish formal celebrations and services. Your kids enjoy it, and you are able to share life's adventures and trials with the support of a caring community.

The motto of the Family Group Movement is "a family for all". You don't have to be a Catholic, a parent, old or young, married, or single - you just have to be yourself!

The Parish Council has decided to re-start this initiative (it was part of the parish in earlier days) as an important strategy in connecting parishioners and their families with the broader parish family. Pentecost is an opportune time to remind ourselves that the Holy Spirit empowers us to move outside of ourselves and to connect with one another, no matter what our ethnic or diverse cultural backgrounds are, and to become an inclusive and welcoming community.
